Located in an area close to the mountains, the building's scale and character reflect the dispersed rural nature of the local housing. The interior spaces communicate with the landscape via large windowpanes. One distinctive feature of the house is its covered veranda with a view of the mountains. The interior – an open space defined only by the outer walls – consists of a live-in studio with a gallery in the attic. All utility and technical rooms are arranged within a closed block at the far end of the house. The wooden shed running along the building's entire length provides covered parking and acts as a terrace. The house is an easily assembled timber frame building with a facade consisting of insulating aluminum panels. The use of timber framing prevails in the interior as well, with the final surface inside and outside covered in aluminum cladding.
